

Anointing of the Sick/Funeral Arrangements. Call the parish office. If the office is closed the answering machine will provide an emergency phone number for you to reach a priest.


Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

The words of Jesus bring us hope. Some people will vehemently claim that they do not need organized religion because they know God in their heart, or they find God in nature, and that is enough. These claims are rooted in the truth, but only partly. God has planted a yearning for him in the human heart, and God's might and power are evident in the magnificence of creation. However, there is a higher order of revelation we must not ignore. This is God's revelation of himself that comes to us through the words of the prophets, and then, most fully, through his Son, Jesus.

Why should anyone be content with just a whisper from God within oneself, or a shadow of God in nature? Jesus was real. He walked among the people. He extended His hand in healing time and time again, ate with His friends and sometimes with His enemies, and welcomed sinners and strangers into His company. Jesus brought hope to those who were living in sin and relief to those suffering dreadful afflictions. Simple words from Jesus bring about powerful results, such as those we heard today, Quiet! Come out of Him!

The words of Jesus brought healing and forgiveness, and they also brought comfort and direction in times of uncertainty. He said, "Follow me, I will make you fishers of men; Be not afraid; I will be with you always; Today you will be with me in paradise." Such powerful words – no one had ever spoken in this manner before. The absolute authority with which Jesus spoke moved many people to follow Him





To listen closely to the teachings of Jesus is every Catholic's responsibility today. It is easy to hear the Scriptures proclaimed each time we attend Mass, but it can be more difficult to listen with a receptive ear and a willing heart, and harder still to put those lessons into practice.

The words of Peter from Saint John's Gospel express it well; "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." We are to listen, believe and live accordingly. This is our task, and the Spirit of God alive in us will help us accomplish it.

2021 Catholic Faith Appeal: Now More Than Ever

As part of our Parish's commitment, we have been assigned the same goal of \$572,000 this year for the annual Catholic Faith Appeal. We are so very blessed that our Parish Family was able to meet this goal last year, and we have been called to do so again. The Catholic Faith Appeal reflects the opportunity to act in concert with 60 other Parishes to address needs we all consider important as Catholics right here in Southwest Florida. Some of the programs the CFA gifts support include:

- **Catholic Charities:** As a leading provider of social services, Catholic Charities supports over 40,000 people with programs like direct assistance to pay their utility bills, emergency intake programs for those who have become homeless, ending human trafficking in our backyard, citizenship assistance, and veteran housing.
- Catholic Schools: It costs a tremendous amount to provide a high-quality education, and the CFA supports the Catholic Schools in the area to ensure members of our community can have access to this faith-based education system through high school.
- **Vocations:** From the Seminarian programs that instruct our future priests and deacons to providing support for the 35 different women's religious orders and 26 different communities of brothers and priests within the Diocese, the CFA ensures we provide for the education and well-being for those who have dedicated their lives in service to us and our faith.

Every dollar that our Parish goes over our CFA Goal will come back to the church as income that is not assessed for the next year's goal. We will use all the excess directly to the **Finish the Church** loan principal, assisting us in shortening the time it will take us to fulfill this obligation. Ministry Spotlight

St. John Sewing Ministry Keeps People Safe and Warm

Saint John's Sewing Ministry has had a very busy, challenging 2020. However, our group has still managed to sew, buy, and distribute to the community more than ever before as the need became so great because of Covid. We made 97 white masks for the St. John's first communicants, dozens of masks for the Gargulio Learning Center, 300 felt shapes for pre-schoolers at Grace Place, fleece blankets and clothing for the Shelter for Abused Women and Children, newborn blankets, bibs, burp cloths, and other sundries for both the Immokolee Teenage Parenting Program and the Naples Teenage Parenting Program.

Two of our year round members, Phyllis Crivelli and Marianne Swan went to Catholic Charities on the campus of St. Leo's in Bonita and were part of their food pantry on six different occasions between July and December and distributed 386 articles of clothing and blankets. The Knitting Ministry generously gave us many blankets and sweaters to distribute as well. We rely on donations of both child-appropriate fabrics as well as monetary donations to purchase other supplies and fabrics that we use.
