Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Prior to the coming of the Holy Spirit, the apostles were virtually living in hiding in the upper room. A great task had been entrusted to them, yet they had neither the strength nor the will to begin it. But after the coming of the Holy Spirit, they were changed people. They left their hiding place and set out courageously to preach the Gospel.

What was it that the Spirit did to them? In promising the Spirit, Jesus said to them, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem, but ... to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) I think the key word here is the word 'power.' Power was precisely what they needed. At the moment they felt completely powerless. They were crippled with fear and a sense of inadequacy. They felt totally incapable of carrying out the task of preaching the Gospel and witnessing to Jesus. After all, they had witnessed what happened to Jesus. They needed courage. They needed someone to empower them.

Empowerment is one of the 'in' words nowadays, and with good reason. We have seen individuals or groups of people who initially felt powerless to change their situation suddenly become able to do so when someone empowered them. We have seen what a good motivator can do for a football team. Players who had been lacking in self-belief begin to believe in themselves and play away above their normal abilities.

What does empowerment mean? In the first place, it means to give or delegate power or authority to someone; to authorize someone. This wouldn't apply to the apostles – they had already been given that by Jesus.

In the second place, it means to give ability to or to enable someone to do something. This is the usual sense in which the word 'empowerment' is used, and it certainly applies to the apostles at Pentecost.

When people are empowered, they become able and willing to take charge of their situation. They no longer wait for someone else to do it for them. They accept that they and they alone have to do something about it.

The Holy Spirit empowered the apostles. He came down on them in the form of wind and fire. Wind and fire (heat) are symbols of power. Wind has the power to move, to uproot. Fire has the power to refine and transform.

The power they symbolize here is the power of God. Here they symbolize the presence and action of God. The coming of the Spirit provided the apostles with the energy, the momentum, the enthusiasm, the courage, the love, and the passion to get on with the task Christ had given them. The Holy Spirit would help them, but he wouldn't do it for them.


However, we mustn't think that the change in them came about in an instant. It had to be a gradual thing. It had to be a growth process, and growth can be slow and painful. We do not easily let go of old ways, old habits, and old attitudes.



People change when they are given hope; when someone believes in them and gives them a task to do; when someone takes an interest in them. Above all, they change when they are loved. They come out of their shells, and hidden energies are released in them. The miracle of human change is the only real miracle.

We, too, need someone to empower us so that we are able to take charge of our lives, and live them responsibly. This means being willing to change what needs to be changed. But we especially need empowerment in order to witness to our Christian faith. The power that changed the apostles is available to us, too. The Holy Spirit energizes and strengthens our spirits and warms and purifies our hearts.



Reading II 1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13

Brothers and sisters: No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord: there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.





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
