Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Once a man went to see a friend of his who was a professor at a great university. However, as they sat chatting in the professor's office, they were continually interrupted by students who came knocking at the door, seeking the professor's advice about something or other. Each time the professor rose from his chair, went to the door, and dealt with the student's request. Eventually the visitor asked the professor, "How do you manage to get any work done with so many interruptions?"

"At first I used to resent the interruptions to my work. But one day it suddenly dawned on me that the interruptions were my work," the professor replied.

That professor could have locked himself away and devoted his time to his own private work. In that way, he would no doubt have had a quieter life. But being the generous and unselfish person that he was, he couldn't do that. Instead, he made his work consist in being available to his students. It was no surprise that he was greatly loved by the students. And it was no coincidence that he was one of the happiest and most fulfilled professors on the campus.

Unselfishness is never easy. Yet at certain times it's easier than at others. It's easier when we are able to plan our good deeds – when the deed is of our own choosing, and we happen to be in the mood, and it causes us the minimum inconvenience and disruption. At other times, unselfishness is particularly difficult: when the deed is not of our own choosing, when we don't feel in the mood, and when it is sprung on us at an awkward moment. In such cases we have to forget ourselves, and set aside our feelings and our plans. A real sacrifice is involved.

An act of kindness is judged not so much by its importance, but by the disruption it causes in the life of the one who does it. It's a great test of people when, at the drop of a hat, they put aside their own plans to help another person.

It's a consolation for us to know that Jesus, too, had to cope with interruptions. He, too, had His plans upset. Today's Gospel tells us that He was in such demand that He and His apostles scarcely had time to eat. However, at some point, He decided that enough was enough, and took the apostles off to a quiet place for a break.

This time He wasn't thinking of Himself but of His apostles. They had just come back from the mission on which He had sent them. He saw that they needed a rest. So He decided to take them off to a quiet place. The caregivers, too, need to be cared for.

However, things didn't work out as planned. The people followed them. How did Jesus react? Far from getting annoyed, He received the people. This tells us a lot about the kind of person He was. He was moved with pity for them. He saw that they were leaderless. The official teachers had no time for the ordinary people. But Jesus had time for them. This is why they flocked to Him.

All of us are capable of caring. The need for caring people is great. Neglect is widespread in our society. There are many people in our world who are like sheep without a shepherd. When we care, we are living the Gospel. Good can come out of interruptions. They prevent us from becoming totally preoccupied with ourselves. Selfishness is a kind of prison. Love, on the other hand, sets us free.

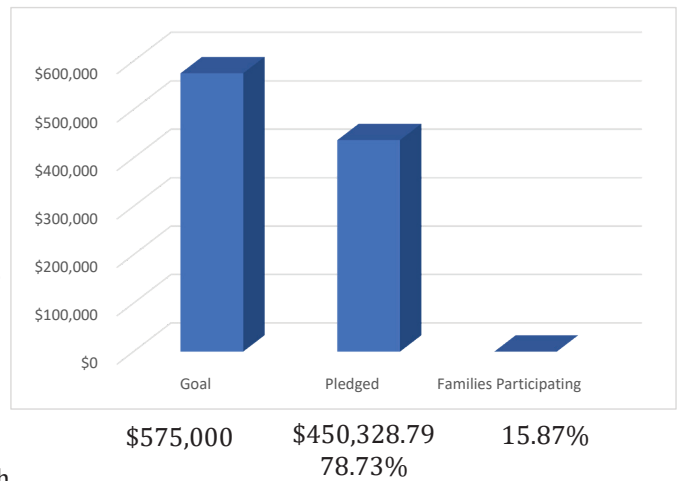

Works of MERCY

“My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.” (Jhn. 15:12)

The primary purpose of a special commitment to the poor is to enable them to become active participants in the life of society. Supporting those living in poverty, defending vulnerable individuals, and promoting justice is the long tradition of the Church. The Catholic Faith Appeal supports programs and services aimed to address these matters.

One example is the **Peace and Social Justice Office** which helps bring Gospel values to domestic and international public policies and assists the Faithful to implement the principles of Catholic Social Teaching.

The **Respect Life Office** supports the Diocese of Venice’s efforts to promote and uphold the Church’s teaching on life issues. Some of these efforts include promoting a peaceful, prayerful witness during the 40 Days for Life Campaign, offering help through Project Rachel to those suffering deep pain and grief after an abortion, as well as lobbying for legislative initiatives that impact the dignity and respect of the human person.

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Venice provides a comprehensive network of services aimed at promoting and facilitating self-sufficiency. The programs offer support and opportunities that empower individuals, families and communities to grow and thrive. This includes the **Casa Maria Soup Kitchen**, that annually serves approximately 35,000 hot meals at lunchtime to the hungry and impoverished; and **Our Mother’s House**, offering homeless single mothers with children housing, parenting skills, vocational training, financial literacy courses, and education for the children.

During crisis such as the aftermath of a hurricane or, more recently, the Pandemic, the **Disaster Response and Recovery Program** of Catholic Charities leaps into action. This program offers assistance to those most impacted.

Catholic Charities **After-School Reading Program** is known for its individualized reading instruction for struggling and disadvantaged students in

High School Confirmation: All Are Welcome!

In the Diocese of Venice, the sacrament of Confirmation encompasses two years of preparation, typically in ninth and tenth grade. However, each program year often includes students in eleventh and twelfth grade who have not yet received this sacrament. We view the program as a journey, rather than a race. In this way, young adults are afforded the opportunity to explore their faith at a reasonable pace given the many other obligations that occupy time in their lives. Students study the faith, choose sponsors to help them along their journey, and get to know their chosen saint who will provide inspiration to each candidate through extraordinary stories of living the faith.

Our confirmation program is open to ALL high school age youth. We meet on either Sunday afternoons throughout the school year and attend Mass together as part of the class session. Our video-based program, CHOSEN, by Ascension Press, provides the framework for what will be small-sized formation groups, along with other key events like retreats, youth rallies, service opportunities, and youth bible studies. A schedule of our upcoming class dates can be found on the parish website. We look forward to seeing everyone in the fall! High School youth should register by August 15th and may print forms off of our website or pick up forms in our parish office beginning July 1, 2021. Our first class session begins on Sunday, August 29th at 4:00-6:00 p.m.

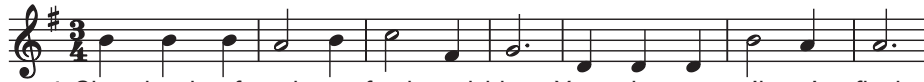

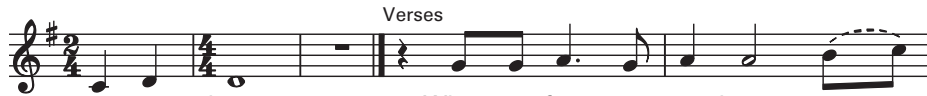

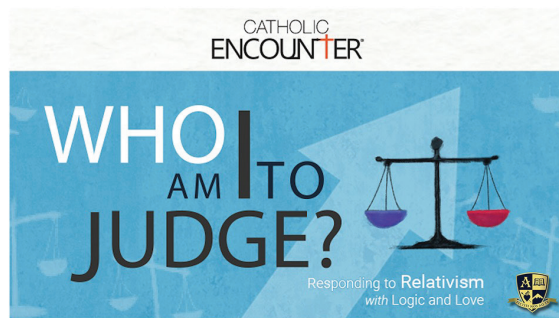
