Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Of all the ways that God feeds us, there is one unique, supremely valuable, and incredibly nourishing way – through His presence in the living Christ. God wants us to understand that if we feed upon Jesus, our Bread, we will be nourished as in no other way. "I am the Bread of Life," Jesus says." He who comes to Me shall not hunger. He who believes in Me shall not thirst. I am the Living Bread which came down from Heaven. If anyone eats of this Bread, he will live." As you identify with Christ, as you let Christ give you life – as you abide with Christ and accept Christ at the center of your being – you are being nourished in the most saving way possible. If you believe this, you will "have eternal life," Jesus told Nicodemus.

The incredibly Good News of the Gospel is that God feeds us in this way and offers us this nourishment for our salvation. Most of us seem to be aware of this, somehow, when a crisis comes along. We know the nourishment is here, and we turn to it. But when the pressure is relieved, we stop relating to Jesus in this way. We seem to miss the point that Christ our Bread is with us all the time. I am convinced that the failure of so many of us Christians to put Christ our Bread at the center of our lives is the reason for the great unease and the restlessness among so many of us these days. On the surface, a great many of us "have it made" in this society. Everything seems to be going along well enough. There is the house and the car. The kids are in school. There is the job, the status in the neighborhood, the annual vacation, the movies, the TV, the sports, and hobbies – so many of the things we think we need. But at the center of it all, for a great many of us, there is an emptiness, a feeling of anxiety, a sense of something missing. So many folks are feeling this way today, and not just the young.


We have come here today to remind ourselves that Christ our Bread is present to us, moment-by-moment, to take away the emptiness. Not just in crises. Moment-bymoment Christ is offering us the nourishment we need to sustain our sense of purpose and our sense of meaning. Moment-by-moment He is giving us a sense of hope that our lives are going someplace. And that's why we are here – to celebrate the Good News. "I am the Bread of Life;" Jesus tells us, "He who comes to Me shall not hunger, and he who



believes in Me shall never thirst." Of all the ways that God feeds us, there is one unique, supremely valuable, and incredibly nourishing way – through this presence in the living Christ.

Sometimes we feel like prisoners of the world, looking out at a situation that threatens to overwhelm us. It is then that Jesus tells us, Hang in there! Come to the table, and I will satisfy your hunger and quench your thirst for the truth that will make you free. And I will teach you to laugh the laughter of God.

With assistance from the **Diocesan Department** of Communications, a **televised Mass** is made available weekly for the homebound, hospitalized and all those unable to attend Mass at a local Parish. With the temporary suspension of public Mass during the Pandemic,

this broadcast became a spiritual lifeline to many in Florida and even other parts of the country. Daily and Sunday Masses are also live streamed on Facebook.



The **Worship Office** serves as a resource to Parish Liturgical Committees for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy throughout the Diocese of Venice. This became evident during the Pandemic when the Office provided guidelines and standards to Parishes for safe personal interaction during Masses.

College Campus Outreach is charged with the challenge of bringing the Faith to thousands of college students each year. Students are encouraged to enhance their spiritual lives and are trained to become future lay leaders of the Church.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Retreat and Spirituality Center and Campo San José Retreat Center both offer workshops, retreats (private and group), and conferences for those who want to enrich their spiritual lives or further develop their faith through sacramental formation and an increased prayer life. These locations offer quiet and solitude, along with the Sacrifice of the Mass, confession, and spiritual direction.

> Prison Outreach shares the Gospel of Jesus Christ and brings the Eucharist to practicing Catholics who are incarcerated. Last year while Masses were temporarily suspended in correctional facilities, the members of the ministry team were able to bring the Mass and religious educational materials virtually to those seeking spiritual support.




The process of donating blood is safe and easy, and you should not hesitate in giving. Your donation will make a profound difference to someone whose life depends upon it.

Scripture Readings

Reading I Ex 16:2-4, 12-15

Mass Worship Aid

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them,

"Would that we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" Then the LORD said to Moses,

"I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not.

"I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God."

In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them,

"This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat."

you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds; that is not how you learned Christ, assuming that you have heard of him and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus, that you should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth.

Gospel Jn 6:24-35

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus. And when they found him across the sea they said to him,

"Rabbi, when did you get here?"

Jesus answered them and said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal."

So they said to him, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?"

Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent."

So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: He gave them bread from heaven to eat."

So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always."

Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."
