St. John the Evangelist is pleased to welcome Fr. Mark Harris to our Parish Family. We congratulate him on his July 31 Ordination!

Before entering the seminary, Fr. Harris worked at various marketing and corporate jobs including interior design, marketing, and career development.

Through the years, he explained how he would

have profound spiritual moments when he was comforted by or connected to the Lord in a particular way. These experiences helped to guide his life into changing careers and eventually becoming an elementary school teacher in the Charlotte County School District. While he loved teaching, he realized, in his heart, that it wasn't the right fit. This realization caused him to start volunteering at Sacred Heart Parish in Punta Gorda, first as a Eucharistic Minister and then as a catechist assisting with the Faith Formation

Program, Youth Peer Ministry, and Core Adult Ministry Team.

These experiences solidified his resolve to do more in service of the Lord and led him to enter the seminary. That process included first talking with a priest mentor from Miami where he spent many of his formative years. He eventually approached the Diocese of Venice and Bishop Frank J. Dewane to inquire about becoming a Diocesan seminarian.

Born in Miami, Fr. Harris spent part of his childhood alternating between living in Florida and Connecticut. He was primarily raised by two aunts, Nancy Haizlip and Donna Storey. He earned degrees in Commercial Art and then Business Marketing and Management from Florida Metropolitan University, before earning a Master's in Education from Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Conn.

After being accepted as a Diocesan seminary in 2017, he was sent to begin his intensive formation and studies at St. John XXIII National Seminary in Weston, Massachusetts, which is committed to the human, spiritual, academic, and pastoral formation of candidates aged 30 and older. While a seminarian for the Diocese, Fr. Harris served summer assignments at Epiphany Cathedral, Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Venice, and Resurrection Parish in Fort Myers.

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

There are times in life when people must be encouraged to do what is best for them. A child is told to eat her vegetables. A youth is told to engage in his studies. A sick person is encouraged to take his medicine. An angry person who has been wronged is asked to forgive. These words are spoken so as to move us to do what will make our lives better. They must be spoken boldly, sometimes even harshly, but always backed with love and concern.

The word of the Lord is spirit and life. It is spoken with sincere love and concern for our lives. Through His word, God calls us to be holy as He is holy. Through His word, He forms us to be His people. Through His word, He strengthens us. We must be open to listen to His word and to accept it into our hearts. In doing so, we receive the blessings that strengthen us to fulfill its commands and teachings in our daily lives. As God's word takes root in our daily lives, we manifest the presence of God to the world. This living word of God leads to eternal life.

The great prophet Elijah was filled with the Spirit of God and yet, in his humanness, he was discouraged to the point of death. We hear in our first reading how God encouraged him. He speaks to Elijah through an angel calling him to be nourished. This nourishment went beyond a physical feeding to a spiritual feeding that strengthened him to fulfill his mission. Elijah listened and accepted. He was strengthened to do what God asked him to do.

Jesus, the living word of God, came as bread from heaven so as to nourish and strengthen people unto eternal life. Just as God fed the people of Israel in the desert with bread from heaven so as to strengthen them for their forty-year journey in the desert, so, too, Jesus came to strengthen all who will come to Him on their journey to the Kingdom of God. Jesus nourishes His people with His holy word, which is clear instruction and encouragement from God. He uses the physical image of bread to speak of Himself so as to make it clear that His life feeds them. This image becomes even clearer at the Last Supper when He gives us his Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist.

There are times when the burdens and crosses of daily life seem to get heavy for us. We can be discouraged like Elijah and simply want to give up. There are times when we do not understand, and we murmur and question like the Jews of today's Gospel. Sometimes, we grieve the Holy Spirit by

allowing our bitterness and frustrations to move us to lash out at others with anger, fury, and shouting. Our readings caution us against such things. Instead, they call us to be strengthened through the divine encouragement the Lord gives us through His holy word, the Eucharist, and the life of the Holy Spirit within us.

In His great love, God is always concerned about us. He orders everything so that we may have life. It is imperative for us to listen, to accept, receive, and be strengthened by the holy nourishment that God gives us. Through it, we not only come to be like our loving God, we will come to be with God.

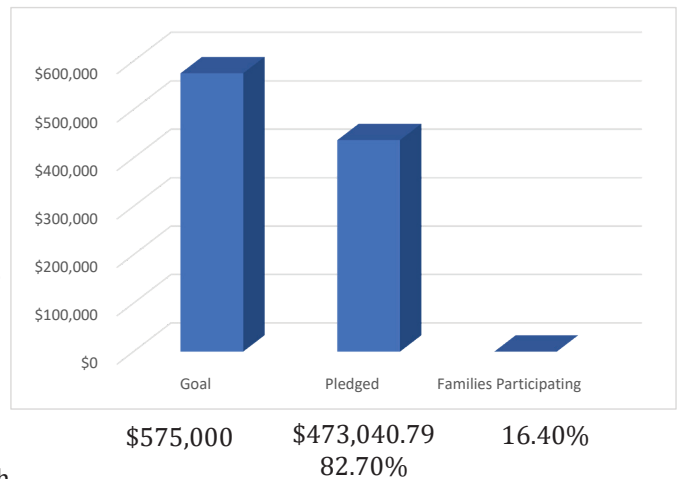
Help Us Reach 40% Participation in Serving the Community Through the CFA

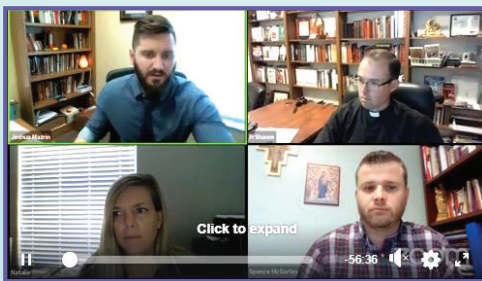


CFA Supports

EVANGELIZATION

“No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher.” (Luk. 6:40)

Through workshops, conferences and much more, the **Office of Evangelization** strives to meet the call to form disciples and spread the Gospel. Initiatives are dedicated to Bible study and enhancing the knowledge of the Catholic Faith. The Men's and Women's Conferences are hosted each year to connect the Faithful in prayer with one another as well as to strengthen individuals and families to live and share the Catholic faith.



The **Office of Youth and Young Adult Outreach** is committed to bringing the joy and truth of the Gospel to the new generation throughout the Diocese of Venice. The Office facilitates large scale Diocesan events and pilgrimages to help create opportunities for youth and young adults to grow closer to the Lord. The outreach also serves the Parishes and schools by offering guidance and support to empower those ministering to this audience. The Youth Rally last fall was conducted on-line for the first time due to the Pandemic.



The **Office of Stewardship and Development** oversees and promotes stewardship best practices to Parishes and Schools through seminars, workshops, and written materials. It also coordinates efforts for the implementation of the Catholic Faith Appeal which provides the necessary support to continue the goal of serving others.



The **Hispanic Apostolate** supports the ecclesial movements and provides information, assistance, and training to Parish pastoral leadership regarding the evangelization of Hispanics. The Apostolate works closely in collaboration with other Diocesan offices and Parishes to support initiatives for the Latino/Hispanic Community. To respond to the needs of this Community, a Catholic formation initiative is offered in Spanish at various Parishes throughout the Diocese. Masses are celebrated in Spanish at 32 worship sites.



To plant and nourish the seeds of the Gospel in ways most suited to the cultures and traditions of the Haitian Community, the **Haitian Apostolate** coordinates programs to fit the needs of parishioners. Masses celebrated in the Creole language are currently available at six Parishes within the Diocese.

The life of Jesus Christ is indelibly engraved upon history. Some people thought he was crazy; others considered him a misfit, a troublemaker, a rebel. He was condemned as a criminal, yet his life and teachings reverberate throughout history. You can't ignore Jesus, because he changed things. He made the lame walk, taught the simple, set captives free, gave sight to the blind, fed the hungry, healed the sick, comforted the afflicted, afflicted the comfortable, and captured the imagination of every generation.

WoW is a group of women who meet 51 Thursdays a year (all except Thanksgiving!) to study our Catholic faith. We alternate from a study on the Bible and then to a Catholic book. 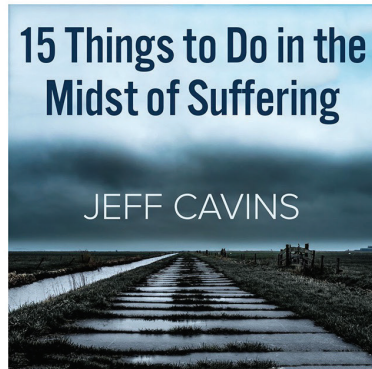

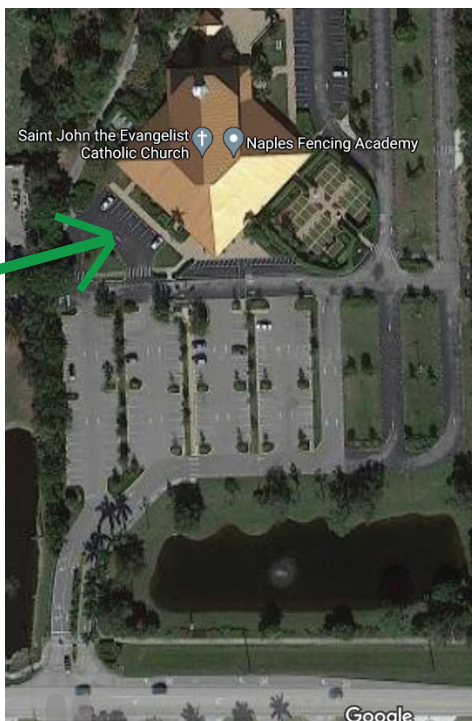
The process of donating blood is safe and easy, and you should not hesitate in giving. Your donation will make a profound difference to someone whose life depends upon it.

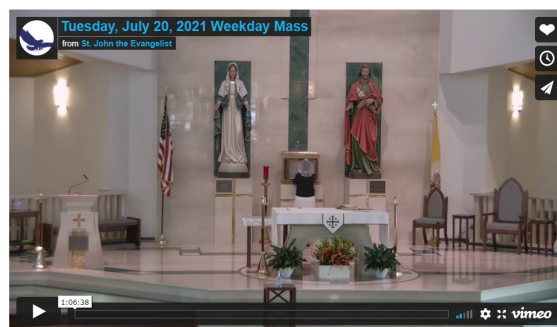
Prayer for Protection During Hurricane Season
