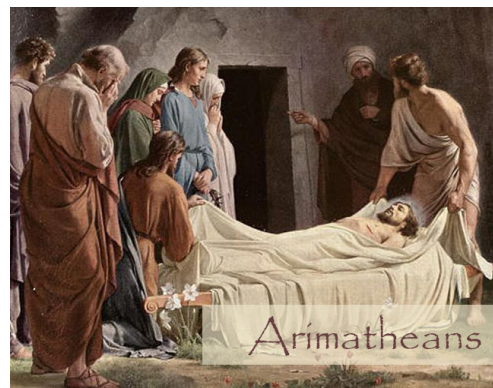
THE HOMEBOUND MINISTRY NEEDS YOUR HELP!!!

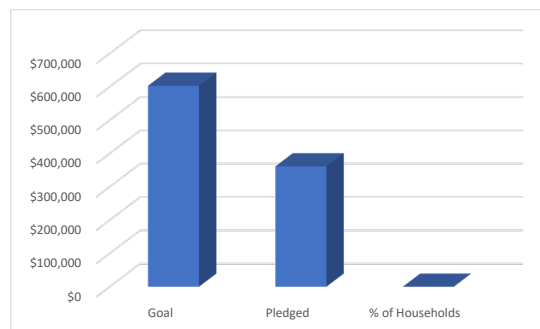
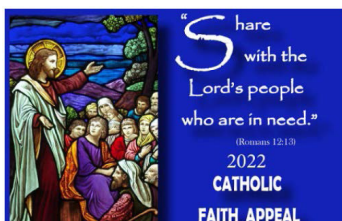

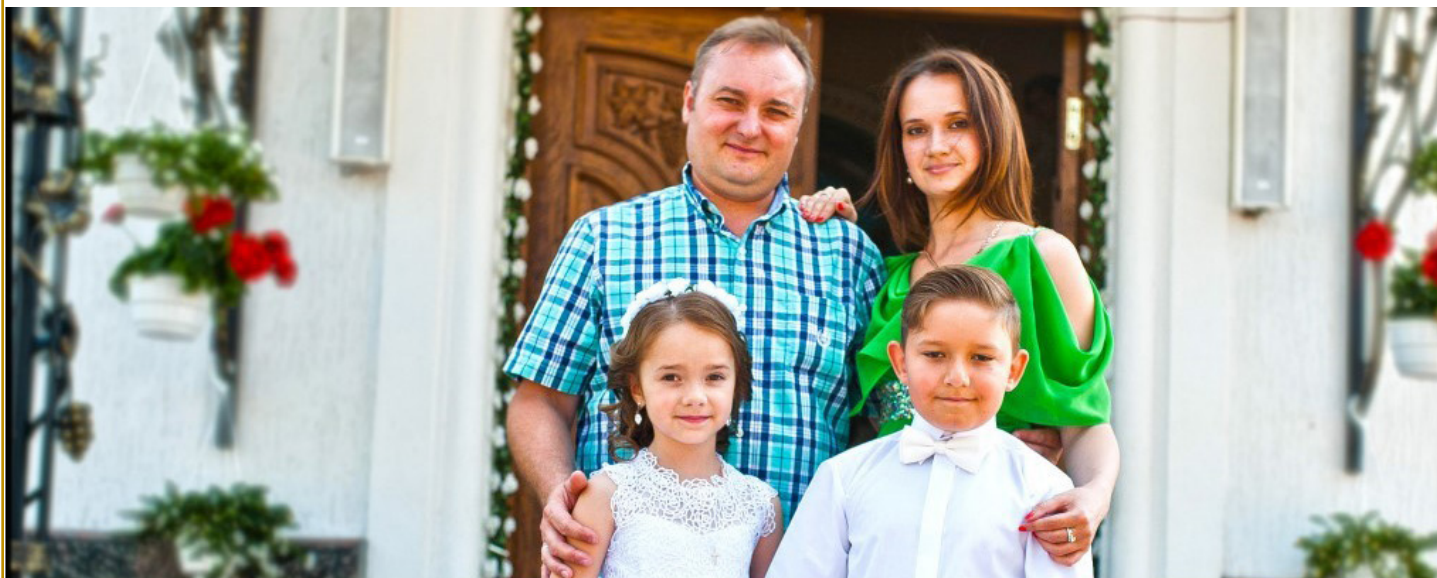

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Venice, Inc. seeks to serve the most vulnerable in our community. Services focus on helping people move from crisis to stability and growth.

Through programs such as Our Mother's House and the Judy Sullivan Family Resource Center, Catholic Charities strives to meet the needs of families by providing housing to homeless mothers and their children; food for children on the weekend; and financial assistance with transportation, rent, utilities, and daycare. Thereby, guiding families on a path of self-sufficiency.

For the aging population, the Golden Gate Senior Center is available for daily hot lunches, socialization, recreation and mental health counseling.

Throughout the Diocese, housing is offered to low-income seniors, veterans, migrant farm workers, and low-to-moderate income families. Transitional and emergency shelter is also available for families in crisis.

The Clothing Room provided by Guadalupe Social Services is open to anyone in the Immokalee community to shop once per month from items that have been donated. The same site also offers *The Shower Program*, where the chronically homeless individuals may receive a change of clothes, hygiene products, and access to clean showers.

Children who are disadvantaged and struggling with reading may participate in the *After-School Reading Program*. This individualized reading program is available to students in kindergarten through fifth grade. Free books are given each year to encourage a bridge of literacy between home and school.



CATHOLIC CHARITIES

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Ancient Jewish Rabbis used to teach that every story in Scripture contained four meanings: a literal meaning, a symbolic meaning, an intended meaning, and a personal meaning.

First, the literal meaning is simply what the gospel story says. Sometimes it is not always clear what a particular story is saying. In today's gospel, however, this isn't the case. It's perfectly clear what the story was saying. In fact, the story is one of the best known narratives in the New Testament. The second meaning is the symbolic meaning. The chief symbolism seems to center around Jesus' question to Peter, which Jesus repeats three times: "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" What symbolism is contained in this threefold question that Peter seemed to find so embarrassing? Many believe the repetition is related to Peter's threefold denial of Jesus on the night of Jesus' arrest. They see Peter's threefold affirmation of love, "Lord, you know that I love you," as erasing his threefold denial of Jesus. In other words, it allows Peter to make amends for his past and to redeem himself.

This brings us to the third meaning: the intended meaning. Why did John relate this incident? What did he intend to communicate to us? A footnote in the New American Bible points out that the First Vatican Council cited Jesus' threefold response to Peter the authority and responsibility to succeed him as chief shepherd of the flock. In other words, Jesus' threefold response to Peter reaffirmed the decision Jesus had made earlier concerning Peter, when he said, "You are Peter, and upon this Rock I will build my Church . . . I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven. Jesus could have reversed that decision, saying to Peter, Simon, I had great leadership plans for you, but you denied me three times. You failed under pressure. So I'm taking away your leadership role and giving it to someone else." But Jesus didn't do that. Rather, he reaffirmed his decision to make Peter the chief shepherd of his flock.

This brings us to the final meaning: the personal meaning. This is the meaning that the gospel story might hold for the attentive reader. In other words, God can use a Scripture passage or story to speak to us in a personal way. For example, take the episode in today's story, where Peter says that he fished all night but caught nothing. Jesus then tells Peter to try again. Peter does, and the result is amazing. He and his helpers catch so many fish that they need another boat to help them. What personal meaning might we draw from this episode? Consider: Novelist A.J. Cronin says that he nearly gave up his writing career before he ever got started. Halfway through his first book, *Hatter's Castle*, which was eventually translated into 19 languages, Cronin says that he threw

his pen down and tossed his half-finished manuscript into an ash can. Then he went outside into the rain and went for a long walk down a lonely rural road in Scotland. He hadn't walked far when he came upon an old farmer ditching a field. The sight of that old farmer, working all alone in the rain, inspired Cronin to retrieve his manuscript from the ash can and try again. Years later, when Cronin became famous, he credited his career to the farmer who inspired him to try again after he had given up the first time around. I would like to think that Christ spoke to A.J. Cronin through the farmer ... something similar to what he said to Peter: "Recast your nets, Peter, and try again." I would like to think that by his unsuccessful first attempt, Cronin learned what Peter learned. He failed the first time because he had been working alone, without the help of Jesus.



Readings for the Third Sunday of Easter

Reading I Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41

When the captain and the court officers had brought the apostles in and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, "We gave you strict orders, did we not, to stop teaching in that name? Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and want to bring this man's blood upon us." But Peter and the apostles said in reply, "We must obey God rather than men. The God of our ancestors raised Jesus, though you had him killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as leader and savior to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins. We are witnesses of these things, as is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him." The Sanhedrin ordered the apostles to stop speaking in the name of Jesus, and dismissed them. So they left the presence of the Sanhedrin, rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name.

They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time

Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to Simon Peter a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." Jesus said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Special Second Collection, May 7-8 for **Jamaica Outreach Program**

JOP recently funded an improved quality of life and overall health of the indigent, elderly residents at Antonino Gabriele Village in Kingston, Jamaica. This elder village was built in 2009 by donors from St. John the Evangelist who contributed to "Father Tom Glackin's Village" upon his retirement. It was designed to serve the impoverished elderly people that were living in squalor with no one to care for them, right outside St Anne's Catholic Church in Kingston.

JOP provides residents with a washing machine, utilities, and food. Before this grant, the laundry space was an area in the yard with a single wash tub, where residents washed their clothes by hand, which is difficult for the elderly.

Nerissa (a local volunteer) shared with us the effort she must go through to bring even a little food to the residents: "It's painful to see them not having a meal sometimes. ...When vendors in the market have leftovers that are about to spoil, I usually go through them and see what I can salvage and take them here to prepare meals. ..."

Future needs include support for food, caretakers, utilities and repairs. JOP hopes to be a major donor to this project.
