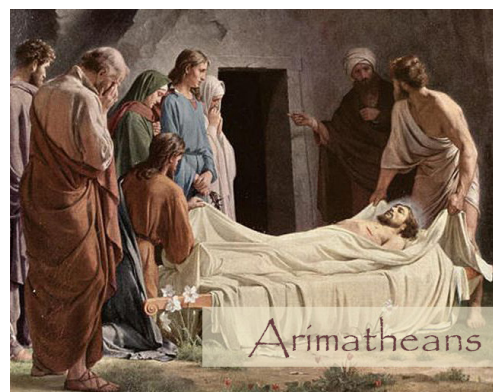
THE HOMEBOUND MINISTRY NEEDS YOUR HELP!!!
